EPA awards scholarships each year to students preparing for a career in print journalism.

The Jerry Jenkins Scholarship

This \$2,000 scholarship was established and funded by best-selling author and former EPA president Jerry Jenkins (1980-81). Jenkins is the former editor of Moody Magazine and founding editor of Today's Christian Woman.

The Douglas J. Trouten Memorial Scholarship

This scholarship was established to honor the former executive director of EPA (2002-2013). Funded by donations and/or EPA's general fund, the amount varies from year to year but grants generally range from \$1,000 to \$2,000.

Requirements

Candidates must be majoring or minoring in journalism or communications. Preference is given to, but not restricted to, students with an interest in the field of Christian journalism. Students must be third- or fourth-year undergraduates or graduate students with at least one year of full-time study remaining when they receive the award. They must be enrolled at an accredited secular or Christian college or university in the United States or Canada. They must have maintained a B average (3.0 on a 4-point scale) or better.

Additional Benefit

In addition to financial assistance, scholarship recipients may have their resumes circulated to EPA publications six months before graduation.

Completed applications must be received in the EPA office by **March 10** of each year. All candidates will be notified of the scholarship committee's decision no later than May 15. The awards are presented at the annual convention held during April or May. Candidates need not be present to win the award.

Please enclose with this application:

1. A short biographical sketch including the following: birthdate, hometown, family, faith story, and something about the factors that shaped your interest in Christian journalism.
2. A copy of your academic record (an unofficial transcript is acceptable).
3. References from your pastor (or church leader) and from an instructor who knows your work (Have them emailed directly to the EPA office from the person making the reference).
4. Three samples of published writing (may be from church or school publications, or unpublished samples if you haven't been published). Important: Do not send originals. Send photocopies of all samples on 8 ½" X 11" sheets. PDF or JPG files are recommended if emailing your application.
5. An original 500- to 700-word essay on the state of journalism today.
6. A recent photo (JPG image).

Evidence of writing skills, as demonstrated through your biographical sketch, writing samples and original essay, will count heavily in the choice of scholarship recipients.
